Notes from the Dec. 2011

Community Meeting

- ◆ The 2012 Community Budget was approved
- ◆ Assigned dates and coordinated responsibilities for spring community events.
- ◆ Website responsibilities have been transferred to Tim Petsky. The software has been updated and he is awaiting BOD feedback on needed changes to website content and organization.
- ◆ Key Day discussed. This year all existing keys and stickers will expire and the BOD is moving to make the process on Key Day more efficient by including the application in this spring's newsletter.
- ◆ Ideas for a new clubhouse continue to be discussed. First priority is to find someone who understands the site and the county's requirements and building code so that feasibility can be established. When this information is obtained the BOD can bring the idea and any monetary requirements to a vote in the community.
- ◆ Rezoning has been a hot-button issue in Severna Park with several areas being tested. Lisa Bender gave us feedback from the most recent Greater Severna Park Council Meeting regarding these issues.

Our Environment

CMIA works on projects that are ‘Bay Friendly’ so that we can reduce our community’s impact on the Severn River and the Bay. We have installed rain gardens, biologists, doggie depots and used native plants in our garden areas. We continue to investigate current technologies and ideas designed to help improve the area we live in. There are several ways you can help:



Plant natives: Natives occur naturally in the region in which they evolved. They have adapted to local soil, rainfall and temperature conditions and have developed natural insect defenses. Everything from bees to deer have evolved with the plants and they use the native plants as habitat and food.

Anne Arundel County Planning and Zoning will supply marsh grass (*Spartina Alterniflora*) upon approval of your application and completion of a site visit. Call 410-222-7441 for more info or go to <http://www.aacounty.org/IP/Forms.cfm> and look for the Emergent Grasses Application Form.

Fertilize with Compost: Did you know that lawns are the biggest crop in the United States, taking up about 40 million acres? The nitrogen and phosphorus in water-soluble fertilizers can easily enter a river or pond where they feed the algae. As overabundant algae die off, they rob the water of oxygen, making it inhabitable for aquatic plants and animals.

Proper use of fertilizers and compost is critical. Choose natural, organic fertilizers, or create your own organic compost to give your lawn the nutrients—and only those nutrients—it needs. The best alternative to water-soluble chemical fertilizers for your lawn is compost. You can make your own or purchase it from garden centers.



A compost ‘bin’ can be as simple as a pile of leaves left to decompose in a corner of your yard or it can be a purchased container made to speed up the decomposition process.

Security

See Something, Say Something

The Officers of the Anne Arundel Police Department recommended the following key points that aid in keeping our families and Carrollton Manor safe.

1. Don’t tempt a criminal. You provide the right elements for a "CRIME OF OPPORTUNITY" if you don’t lock your car doors, and leave a wallet, purse, computer or camera in plain view on a seat.

2. Report crime. Vandalism, petty theft, suspicious persons, drug activity...all small things lead to bigger problems. Call 911 and let the AAPD prioritize the calls.

3. What is a suspicious person? Do they look like they belong and what is their reason for being in your neighborhood? If they represent a business, do they have ID? Are they looking over their shoulder or is it someone sitting in a car watching houses and people. **Call 911. Don’t be embarrassed or think that you are over-reacting.**

4. When calling 911 the key identifiers include CLOTHING, DIRECTION & METHOD OF TRAVEL, DISTINGUISHING MARKS (i.e. tattoos), RACE. Look for these things and write them down. If they are traveling in an automobile, get the license plate. Use your cell phone to take a picture of their license plate and then the vehicle.

5. Keep your kids safe. Follow 1-4 above and be a good parent. That’s tough love ;)

Our community is very safe and the influx of new young families is adding a vibrant pulse to a wonderful place to live. Every house has a tool box for simple repairs and this information is part of your family’s community toolbox.

Carrollton Manor’s Security Team is recruiting volunteers to help keep our community safe. All that is required is a commitment of *any* amount of time to patrol through the neighborhood and give us an extra set of eyes watching out for the benefit of all residents.
